The programme philosophy is to create a learning environment in which innovation, and originality are encouraged and nurtured. There is a strong business grounding within the programme preparing the student to take their place in the fast paced global fashion industry. The degree produces versatile fashion specialists who are able to engage in creative problem solving using a depth of knowledge of the field of fashion. In addition a critical understanding of the social, economic and cultural factors which impact on the professional fashion environment are applied within the working context. The programme guides students through a development path which makes provision for an understanding of the industry, which is inclusive of design and operations concepts, at progressive levels of cognitive complexity. Creativity and artistic flair are incubated within the commercial context, the individual's learning experience is enhanced within the focused and safe learning environment provided by the institution.

### LEVEL 1 (1ST YEAR)

The foundation year introduces the student to the world of fashion and its many intricate facets. ## BACHELOR ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Villioti Fashion Institute seeks serious, responsible and highly motivated students with a passion for fashion. There is no admission formula; every applicant is reviewed individually, according to their skill, experience, achievements and potential for growth. While the admission process recognises the benefits of strong artistic preparation, it also accepts academically accomplished applicants despite limited art or design experience.

Applicants are required to undergo an interview process using a formal admission assessment tool by which we evaluate each student for potential and fit.

The minimum admission requirement is a National Senior Certificate (NSC) (or its same/similar standard, e.g. Senior Certificate with endorsement) with a minimum of 30% in English, and an achievement rating of 4 (50-59%) or better in four recognised 20-credit NSC subjects (Excluding Life Orientation);

Accounting, Agricultural Science, Business Studies, Dramatic Arts, Economics, Engineering Graphics and Design, Geography, History, Consumer Studies, Information Technology, Languages, Life Sciences, Mathematics, Mathematical Literacy, Music, Physical Science, Religion Studies, Visual Arts.

In order to be considered for admission to the programme the student will be required to; submit proof that they have completed Grade 12 or the equivalent, preferably in the form of:

*A National Senior Certificate (NSC)/National Certificate (Vocational) (NCV) that indicates the candidate has met the minimum requirements for admission to a Degree (D) or a Senior Certificate with higher and/or standard grade subjects or an equivalent school leaving certificate.*

Learning how to be successful in fashion involves understanding a wide variety of core principles. These include how to build a body of research, how to use inspiration in the design process, how fabric knowledge and principles of garment engineering, fit and finish effect the quality of a marketable product.

Trends in fashion are analysed and applied to the design process, business management and garment engineering. Ensuring the finished products are in-line with consumer needs and market alignment. The relationships between different sectors of the industry are studied and contextualized. A strong grounding in business management and entrepreneurship is instilled and students experience the real world of fashion through work-integrated learning at a successful fashion company. Entrepreneurship and business management skills are practices in Fashion Events where students manage, produce and run the year-end fashion show.

Electives such as Styling and Millinery offer students careers in alternate fashion avenues and are applied to presentation of their collections featured on the year-end fashion show. This course produces a well- rounded fashion graduate.

Villioti Fashion Institute seeks serious, responsible and highly motivated students with a passion for fashion. There is no admission formula; every applicant is reviewed individually, according to their skill, experience, achievements and potential for growth. While the admission process recognises the benefits of strong artistic preparation, it also accepts academically accomplished applicants despite limited art or design experience.

The programme is aimed at the creative person with a flair for fashion, style and a love for all aspects influencing clothing design.

The programme guides students through the foundational knowledge required to work in the fashion industry at an entry level. The course equips students to design, illustrate and create garments, understand the underpinning knowledge involved in marketing, advertising, buying and retailing. They will further learn the basic life skills to apply effective communication within the work place.

The programme is designed to enable the potential within each student to achieve their optimal potential and engage actively and progressively within the fashion industry.

## PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

This qualification will provide a depth of theory and the level of application needed for entry-level work in established or start-up local fashion ventures. Core disciplines of design and garment engineering, as well as fundamental courses in commercial and contextual areas will ensure a well-rounded graduate. Emphasis is placed on the design and manufacture of basic fashion products, alongside the more specialised skills of digitally-based fashion marketing and entry-level entrepreneurial principles; the integration of these basic and foundational knowledge fields will ensure that graduates are able to design a viable fashion product for a range of audiences and purposes within the local marketplace, and or demonstrate their readiness to enter a Diploma or Degree qualification.

The practical courses 'Fashion Design' and 'Fashion Illustration' will prepare students to design relevant and contemporary commercial collections that are clearly-illustrated in accordance with industry standards. Students will also be prepared to design appropriate garments that can be efficiently manufactured to expected quality standards with the courses 'Pattern Engineering', 'Garment Construction' and 'Clothing Technology'. The latter will provide the necessary grounding in textiles and other fashion industry supplier vocabulary to prepare students for successful communication within the fashion sector.

'Academic Literacy' will provide the building blocks for students to grasp and demonstrate basic academic principles and skills appropriate for written and visual reports. It will also assist in the development of students' study skills which have been shown by recent research as one of the hinderances to improving the throughput rates of undergraduate qualifications in South Africa.

To enable students to start making an income from their skills, they must be able to sell their start-up fashion brand of clothing or themselves through the use of a Curriculum Vitae (CV) in order to attain gainful employment. The 'Fashion Marketing' course will provide the ability to promote their own products (or themselves through their CV) digitally, and the 'Fashion Business Concepts' course will instil an understanding of the basic entrepreneurial principles and practices required to start building their fashion ventures.

### FEBRUARY & JULY ACADEMIC YEAR INTAKES

The purpose of this qualification is to provide an alternate option for passionate students which, on completion, will see them prepared for further study locally or globally or within a specialisation area of the industry. A qualifying student will be able to combine and strengthen their knowledge in a chosen discipline within the total fashion industry, as well as develop research capacity within the appropriate methodologies of that discipline.

This will be achieved through the conducting of supervised research to produce a mini dissertation evidencing their chosen specialisation. The qualification's structure will provide a depth of theory and level of application needed for a postgraduate level mini dissertation, provided by the core disciplines of Fashion Business Thinking and Fashion Theory and Culture, as well as a fundamental course in Research Methodology. Fashion Business Thinking will support students in analysing and criticising how global fashion is responding to the critical and interconnected issues facing contemporary society, including shifting consumer behaviours, ethical concerns, and environmental challenges.

Fashion Theory and Culture will guide students in research and identifying of key historical and contemporary themes related to global fashion consumption and its links to personal identity. Research Methodology will provide students with the tools to conduct initial research and develop a research proposal to position the research topic within the fashion context. In line with this qualification being research-based, students will be given the opportunity to implement a mini dissertation with consideration to the research strategy, formulation of the findings and establishing opportunities for further research.

The Bachelor of Arts Honours in Fashion graduate will be prepared for a higher level of specialisation that is relevant to the graduate's own aptitude and planned career trajectory, as well as opening the avenues of further study or a career in academia. It will similarly provide a bridging pathway to other industries relating to fashion and design based on the student's specialisation.

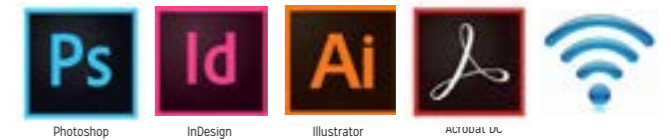

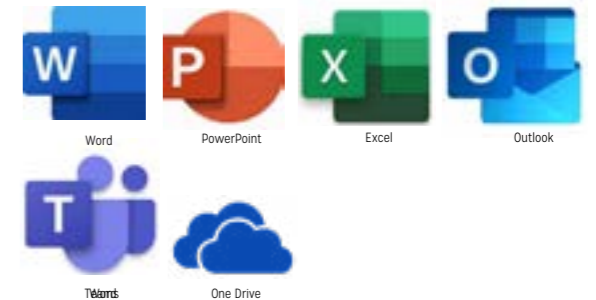

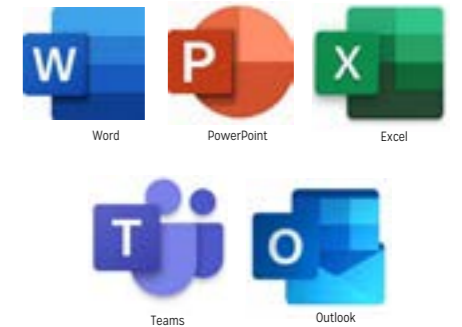

## NON-DEGREE PURPOSE COURSE

Non-Degree purpose courses are available to students who want to pursue an area of academic interest, but have no need or desire for a professional degree.

Non-degree programmes offer an educational experience for individuals who are looking for resume building skills or personal enrichment.

Non-Degree courses are certificated once a student has met all the requirements of the particular course. All the Villioti Fashion Institute courses within our Diploma in Fashion and Bachelor of Fashion programmes are available for registration for non-degree purposes and are credit bearing.

Please note that rules of progression apply and the entrance requirements are equivalent to the Bachelor of Fashion or Diploma in Fashion full time programmes.

Fees for non-degree purpose courses are costed annually per course. R10 000 Registration Fee is to be paid on registration. Fee increases take place on the 1st of November each year. Fees are payable by a Securing Deposit of 50% of the course fee and the balance split over two months payable on the last day of each month from the course commencement date. Only once the student has been successfully assessed and met the entry requirements, paid the registration fee, can it be taken that the student will be able to study at the Villioti Fashion Institute.

# RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

Villioti Fashion Institute considers Recognition of Prior Learning to be the principles and processes through which the prior knowledge and skills of a person are made visible, mediated and rigorously assessed and moderated for the purposes of alternative access and admission, recognition, or further learning and development. RPL in South Africa is critical to the development of an equitable higher education system that facilitates access to, mobility and progression within the Higher Education Sub-Framework (HEQSF). This policy is based on the principles of equity, access, inclusivity and redress of past unfair discrimination with regard to educational opportunities.

The institute is committed to promoting articulation between qualifications by formally recognising and certifying learning achievement. It allows for articulation across the sub-frameworks of the NQF in order to facilitate lifelong learning and provide for the mobility of students and enhance their chances of successfully completing their qualifications.

This is conducted through comparison of provided and recognised competencies against the requirements,

both theoretical and practical in nature, of a recognised qualification or part thereof, and the recognition of both learning and experience, not based on only historical evidence but also on the validity, authenticity and currency of competencies of an applicant.

With RPL, Villioti Fashion Institute will consider learning and experience obtained through formal education and training as well as knowledge and competencies obtained through practical experience and learning. As such the Institute will consider:

- Formal education and training student achievements
- Formal and informal on the job education and training
- Formal and informal coaching and mentoring
- Self-study
- Experience and in-house education and training
- Short courses completed
- Non-degree purpose modules completed

The Institute recognises prior learning in several instances:

- If a candidate has not completed their secondary school exit level but is of a mature age (23) and with sufficient workplace experience (RPL)

- If a candidate has attained their Matric but has not met the entry requirements to the programme, but they have workplace experience (RPL)

- If a candidate has completed parts of the programme at another institution, accredited body, or in an aligned discipline and wishes to be considered for partial exemption from the programme (CAT) insofar as the relevant and applicable evidence of such competencies is made available for consideration and evaluation against the outcomes requirements of the Institute as it is specified and embedded in relevant programme strategies for areas of learning and provision falling into the Institute's scope.

- If a candidate attains the age of 40 years before or during the first year of registration. The candidate would need to submit proof of this and satisfy the RPL Committee (sub-committee of the Exam Committee) of their ability to engage in the programme successfully.

# STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

Villioti Fashion Institute is committed to the provision of student guidance and support to enable student success in as far as possible within the confines of the students' abilities and potential. It is our belief that access without support is not an opportunity. The support of students is integral to the success of the student within the education environment. It is furthermore also recognised that specific non-academic support on a personal level might from time-to-time be needed. In this event, provision is also made to ensure access to relevant support should it be required.

The policy aims to enable students to attain success in their chosen field of study.

## **SUPPORT PRIOR TO REGISTRATION**

Prior to finalisation of registration, potential students are required to attend a personal consultation with an authorised individual. Career guidance and counselling is offered to assist students to identify the programme of study which best suits their intended career path.

## **SUPPORT PRIOR TO COMMENCEMENT OF STUDIES**

Prior to commencement of studies, students are required to officially register as a student and attend orientation sessions in order to prepare them for successful integration into the study programme. Registration is conducted by the Registrar and students are guided through the process to ensure all requirements are met and that they have

a concise understanding of the rules and regulations associated with registration.

Prior to the start of academic year, students attend compulsory orientation sessions where they are provided with information which will assist them to adapt to Institute life and to succeed in their studies with us.

## **ASSESSMENT SUPPORT**

At Villioti Fashion Institute we are sensitive to the importance of the assessment approach engaged in. Assessment is seen to support the learning and teaching process and does not form a part of it. Assessment activities are clear with regards to the requirements, and they are aimed to ensure that students have a good grasp of the materials, knowledge, skills, and competencies which are required to prove competence. Students are supported in their teaching and learning engagement through both formative and summative assessment activities. The actual assessment process is supported through the provision of the relevant infrastructure, tools, equipment, and materials to enable assessment.

Critical feedback as it applies competencies is provided as per the Assessment and Moderation Management Policy of the

Institute. See the Assessment and Moderation Policy of the Institute for more details in this regard.

Various classwork components which are a part of the formative assessment process are included to ensure that the student has a grasp of the knowledge and concepts being taught. Where problems arise, supplementary instruction may be agreed upon by the lecturer and the student and additional work engaged with at an agreed upon time to ensure understanding.

Assessment results, be they formative or summative, very often informs a support engagement which is initiated by the Institute. Results are considered closely by the Quality and Examinations committees to provide support as and where possible.

## **SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT SUPPORT - CONCESSIONS**

Students with a diagnosed physical disability or psychological disorder, whether permanent or temporary in nature, may apply for certain summative assessment concessions. Summative assessment concessions are afforded to individuals with certain learning, physical,

sensory disabilities as well as certain medical conditions which impact on summative assessment writing and academic performance. Summative assessment concessions are necessary to place all students on an equal par and not to provide certain students with an advantage.

Concession applications are reviewed by the examination committee based on evidence supplied by the student. Evidence should include a written recommendation issued by an occupational therapist, educational psychologist, other clinical or counselling psychologist with proven assessment expertise, neurologist or other medical practitioner. The decision to make recommended allowances lay with the examination committee and not with the health practitioner who supplied the assessment or made the diagnosis to support the application.

The following concession may be applied for and granted by the exam committee:

1. Additional time on summative assessment.
2. The use of a computer.
3. The use of a scribe. Scribe fee payable by the student.
4. Oral summative assessment (if possible).
5. Other (to be evaluated by the examination

committee as per the evidence supplied). Each concession application will have to be accompanied by an additional fee payable to the institution dependant on the concession type. Students wishing to apply for summative assessment concession must complete an application form obtainable from the student portal. The completed application, with supporting medical affidavits, must be returned to the administration office who will forward these to the examination committee for consideration.

#### **RED FLAG SYSTEM**

The red flag system was developed to reduce the risk of student course failure, low attendance and students struggling with course work. It is an early warning system which enables the Head of Academic Programmes to evaluate student issues and develop an action plan in conjunction with the student to rectify areas of concern.

#### **PERSONAL SUPPORT**

Where students require support and guidance that is unrelated to the areas of education and learning, the Institute prefers to refer students to relevant expertise and professional support services, in particular where challenges are of a nature requiring qualified counselling and

professional intervention.

#### **INTENSIVE PROGRAMMES**

Where students are battling with a course an additional opportunity is provided for students to engage in an Intensive Programme. This is a specialised individual programme developed for each student in conjunction with the students' profile and areas of lack. The programme will specify the intended outcomes for the specialised programme as well as a daily plan to work against. The aim is to provide the student with the opportunity to improve / better their results. The programme will assist to solidify the foundation for the following year of study.

#### **MENTORSHIP PROGRAMME**

Mentorship is a relationship in which a more experienced or more knowledgeable person helps to guide a less experienced or less knowledgeable person. At the Villioti Fashion Institute each student is issued a mentor to support them throughout their studies. If a student does not feel comfortable with their mentor or feels that their mentor is unapproachable, they may request a mentor change and request a specific mentor.

Mentors support their mentees adjust both socially and academically to college life. Mentors are available to discuss and support students with academic issues, health issues, study issues, personal problems etc. Where a mentor is not able to resolve an issue, the relevant academic staff member will be notified.

### **WORKSHOPS AND GUEST LECTURERS**

The Institute arranges workshops throughout the academic year in order to provide support over and above the normal course of study. Workshops cover topics such as study skills, time management, referencing, master classes, work place readiness, industry visits, international short courses etc.

### **Peer Support**

Where possible and appropriate, collaborative learning opportunities are provided as they offer a strong dimension of student support. The planning of such peer discussion activities into the programme of study is determined by the nature of a course and its intended aims and outcomes.

### **Extended Learning Programme (ELP)**

The Villioti Fashion Institute has a responsibility to provide academic support which will respond to the unique needs of students and maximise their potential. Students whose abilities clearly lie beyond the traditional student population may require differentiated educational opportunities and support facilitated by the Extended Learning Programme (ELP). The ELP is aimed at students who require an extended, personalised educational plan to best meet their needs.

### **POST CERTIFICATION SUPPORT**

The highly practical nature of the learning environment as it relates to the specific area of learning culminates in the hosting of a fashion show where the creations of graduates are displayed. Media coverage and an introduction of graduating students to the fashion industry and public enable effective exposure of the students after graduation to the industry in which they will operate. In addition, students are assisted with the updating of their professional portfolios throughout the programme and are also provided with the skills to compile curriculum vitae's and apply for employment through introduction to the industry.

Past students are always welcomed back for visits and advice. The Institute runs social media pages as well as hosts an alumni communication portal to keep in touch and watch the progress of past students as they launch into their fashion careers, as well as provide information with regards to Institute updates. Available jobs are posted onto the portal and a forum is available for discussion when support is required. The aim of the Institution is to build a community of Alumni all working together to support one another.

Career guidance is ongoing at the Institute and available to all graduates.





# ASSESSMENT RULES

Assessment policy and practice at the Institute recognises the fundamental importance of student assessment for multiple purposes that inform systemic adjustments most particularly to teaching and learning practices at the institution. The assessment requirements for each course are set out in the Course Guides.

Within the Bachelor of Fashion and Diploma in Fashion programmes a student is required to attain a minimum of 60% in practical courses in order to pass. In theory courses the student is required to attain a minimum of 50% in order to pass. In the Higher certificate in Fashion programme, students are required to attain a minimum of 50% in all courses in order to pass. The course mark is made up of formative and summative assessment opportunities.

Academic progress information is available on the Villioti online portal indicating the students' progress through the programme. Rules of progression indicate that the student is required to pass all of the core components at a level before s/he can move into the following core course.

Only on successful attainment of the required credits will the student be in a position to graduate. Certification is closely monitored and informed by the Examination Committee of the Academic Board.

# STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

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## Purpose:

The Student Code of Conduct provides a guideline as to what is expected from students within the learning and teaching environment, their relationships with the Institute, their lecturers, and each other, as well as providing a common ethical basis for individual conduct. The primary purpose of the Code is to promote exemplary conduct. Notwithstanding this, a student will be guilty of misconduct and may be dealt with in accordance with this Code of Conduct agreement if s/he disregards any provision of this Code or fails to comply with any provision thereof. The onus is on the student to familiarise themselves with this code. Ignorance of these statutes does not abdicate adherence thereto.

## General Personal Conduct:

It is expected from a registered student of Villioti Fashion Institute to:

- i. Dress and behave in a manner that enhances the reputation of Villioti Fashion Institute.
- ii. Not smoke any substance in any building used by Villioti Fashion Institute. Cigarette smokers may make use of specific designated areas.
- iii. Not consume or bring any alcohol or intoxicating substances into any building used by Villioti Fashion Institute.
- iv. Act responsibly as far as the use of alcoholic beverages or any other substance with intoxicating effect is concerned (unbecoming conduct outside of the learning environment is strongly discouraged and may lead to disciplinary action if it negatively reflects on Villioti Fashion Institute, e.g., drunkenness, public disorder, etc.).

- v. At all times, not be intoxicated with any non-prescriptive substance which may affect your general demeanour during all Villioti Fashion Institute-related activities.
- vi. Not behave in an unlawful way: if it is against the law of the country, it's against the law of Villioti Fashion Institute, whether you agree with the law or not.
- vii. Be honest, truthful, and conscientious in their approach to and in the performance of their duties. Not steal. Theft will be dealt with as outlined in the Student Disciplinary Policy, followed by possible suspension or expulsion.
- viii. Conduct themselves with courtesy and consideration towards all with whom they encounter, including lecturers, moderators, administrative staff, and other students at Villioti Fashion Institute.
- ix. Maintain discipline conducive to an adult training and learning environment.
- x. Not discriminate unfairly against anyone on account of race, gender, ethnic or social origin, sexual orientation, age, disability, religion, political persuasion, conscience, culture, belief or language or any other arbitrary ground.
- xi. Not behave in a sexually inappropriate manner. Villioti Fashion Institute expects all students to be always respectful to one another.
- xii. Not partake in any violence, actual or threatened. Such behaviour will be dealt with as outlined in the Student Disciplinary Policy, followed by possible suspension or expulsion.
- xiii. Report any grievances to the appropriate body.
- xiv. Take responsibility for damage to furniture or equipment supplied by Villioti Fashion Institute for student use and cover any cleaning or repair costs incurred.

- xv. Keep classrooms tidy. At the end of the day, before leaving, all students must not leave work or equipment lying around. Use the bins provided. Anything left in the class will be thrown away by the cleaning staff.
- xvi. Adhere to the Lecture Room Code of Conduct and Resource Centre Code of Conduct.
- xvii. Engage in community engagement activities where by Villioti Fashion Institute can positively contribute to society.

## Academic Conduct:

It is expected that registered students of Villioti Fashion Institute:

- i. Take responsibility for their own learning and academic progress.
- ii. Attend compulsory Programme orientation sessions.
- iii. Familiarise themselves with the policies of Villioti Fashion Institute during compulsory Programme orientation sessions.
- iv. Arrive for classes on time as per the scheduled Programme implementation plan as to not disrupt lectures or other students.
- v. Not use cell phones during theory lectures or presentations. Incoming text messages do count. The lecturer has the right to confiscate your cell phone and will return it to you at the end of the day.
- vi. Be orientated to the use of equipment and machinery utilised in the programme as per Villioti Fashion Institute's safety requirements.
- vii. Are considerate when using the Resource Centre as

per the Resource Centre Code of Conduct. Conclude relevant assessments and projects within the timeframes provided for such. Where submissions are late, Villioti Fashion Institute implements a punitive assessment scale per day's late submission with a 10%-mark deduction per day, up to three days late only.

- viii. Attend a minimum of 80% of scheduled lecture time per course to be deemed prepared for final assessments. Where students are absent due to illness, a doctor's note must be handed in for the maintaining of personal records.
- ix. Achieve a minimum of 50% in theory components and 60% (50% for Higher Certificate) in practical components to be deemed competent and awarded relevant credits.
- x. Attain Duly Performed requirement of 40% for theory formative assessments prior to admission to summative assessments.
- xi. Attain Duly Performed requirement of 50% (40% for Higher Certificate) for practical formative assessments prior to admission to summative assessments.
- xii. Complete relevant courses in progression to achieve the required outcomes.
- xiii. Successfully complete all courses of learning to be awarded their qualification.
- xiv. Conclude all required formative assessments to enable access to summative assessments.
- xv. Submit a formal doctor's note when absent from pre-scheduled assessments to enable re-scheduling should it be warranted.
- xvi. Avoid assessment misconduct and plagiarism, which are disciplinary offences, as incorporated in the Assessment and Moderation Management Policy and Student Disciplinary

Policy.

- xvii. Book meetings via Calendly with lecturers, to track own progress and address own areas of improvement when necessary.
- xviii. Use your assigned email address for all academic related emails to Villioti Fashion Institute.
- xix. Complete from time-to-time specific evaluations utilised for internal quality management purposes.
- xx. Respect the confidentiality of Institute intellectual property, policies, and procedures. If somebody asks you for a copy of Villioti Fashion Institute's documents, direct them to the Head of Academic Programmes for a personalised copy.
- xxi. Get approval from Villioti Fashion Institute Marketing Department to use Villioti Fashion Institute's name and logo in the media, on your work, in association with your name or at exhibitions.
- xxii. Appeal academic results when feeling prejudiced by following Villioti Fashion Institute's Student Appeals Policy and Assessment and Moderation Management Policy downloading the Appeal Form from the Student Portal.
- xxiii. Submit a grievance/complaint formally as per the Grievance Policy and allow Villioti Fashion Institute the opportunity to rectify the concerns and complaints.
- xxiv. Bring their own personal computer and necessary equipment in order to partake in their lessons.





# GRIEVANCE

Villioti Fashion Institute is committed to promoting mutual respect amongst all members within the academic environment in which we operate. This commitment includes students, staff, administrative officers and fixed term contract employees alike. In all issues of fair treatment, the Institute seeks to understand and address concerns without having to resort to formal grievance procedures. When that is not possible, the Institute commits, at all levels, to the fair and reasonable resolution of issues by means of a formal grievance process. Where matters of concern relating to teaching and learning requirements, delivery, assessment, quality of material, discrimination, harassment, victimisation or other issues may arise, a student may lodge a formal grievance. The Disciplinary Committee of the Institute makes provision for handling all academic and related grievances. However, the Institute acknowledges that there may be a need for an appropriate external and independent agent to mediate between the parties involved. When and if the need arises the Institute undertakes to engage with an external and independent agent in order to resolve grievances. Any formal grievance must be made to the line manager/lecturer/mentor within seven (10) working days of the incident occurring.

## **WHO MAY LODGE A GRIEVANCE**

A grievance may be lodged by any aggrieved person at the Institute be they a student or a staff member (employee). The person filing the grievance must be the alleged victim of unfair treatment; a grievance cannot be filed on behalf of another person.

## **GROUNDS FOR LODGING A GRIEVANCE**

Student grievance may be lodged under the following circumstances:  
Defamatory remarks by another student or staff member. Conflict that arises from studying conditions. Any issue making continued studies intolerable. Conflict that develops among students, and /or between students and their lecturers or other staff members. Any other grievances which may have arisen during the normal course of engagement at the Institute.

Which substantially limits their prospects of entry into. Or advancement in employment

## IMPAIRMENT

An impairment may either be physical or mental or a combination of both. Physical impairment means a partial or total loss of bodily function or part of the body. It includes sensory impairments such as being deaf, hearing impaired, or visually impaired. Mental impairment means a clinically recognised condition or illness that affects a person's thought processes, judgement or emotions.

## LONG TERM OR RECURRING

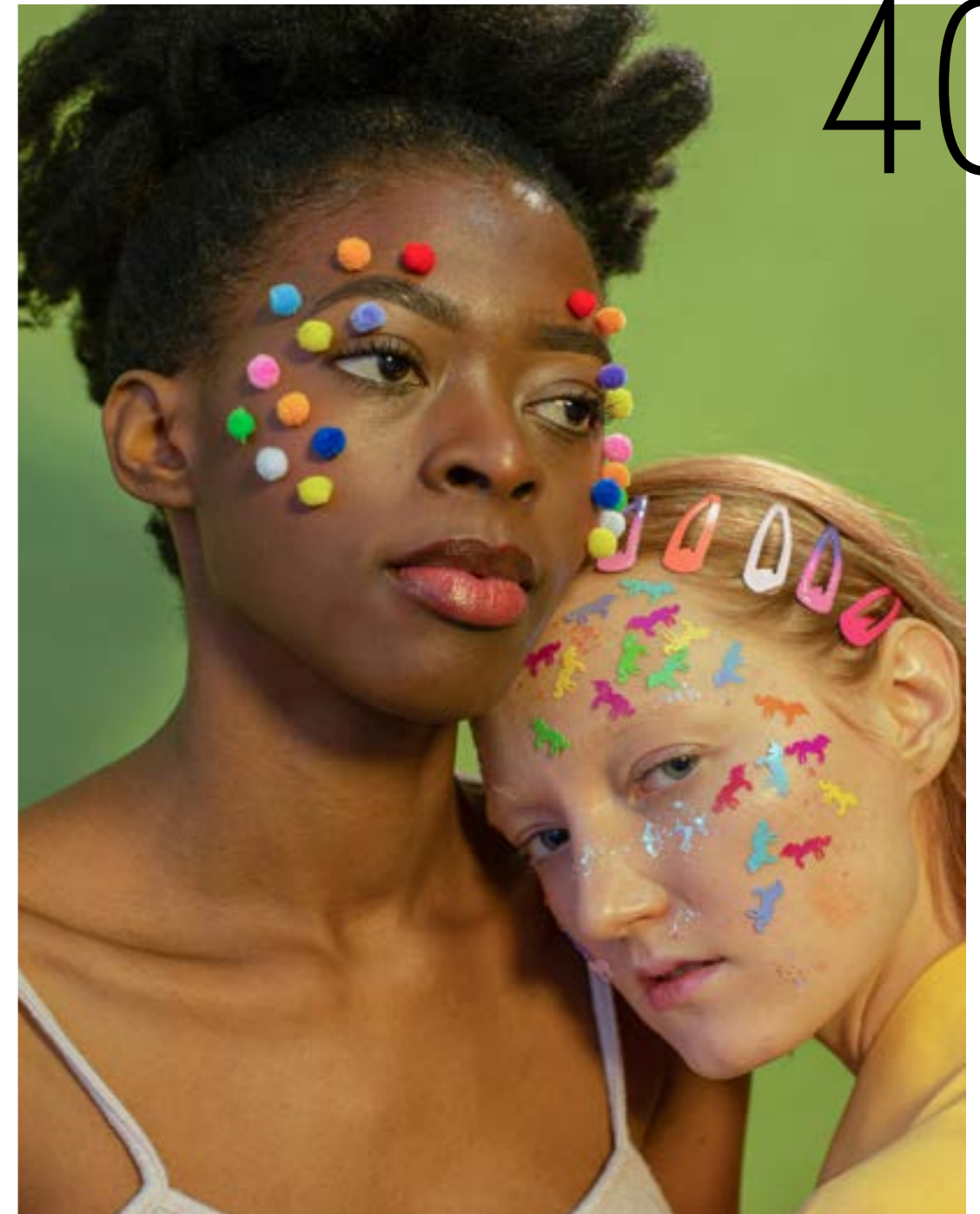
Long term means the impairment has lasted or is likely to persist for at least twelve months.

Recurring impairment is one that is likely to happen again and to be substantially limiting (see below). It includes a chronic condition, even if its effects on a person fluctuate.

Progressive conditions are those that are likely to develop or change or recur. People living with progressive conditions or illnesses are considered as people with disabilities once the impairment starts to be substantially limiting. Progressive or recurring conditions which have no overt symptoms or which do not substantially limit a person are not disabilities. People who have substantially limiting conditions in accordance with the code will not be considered unless a suitably qualified person has determined that there is a substantially limiting disability. The Institute's policy on disabilities is all encompassing as it includes both the needs of students and staff.

For the purposes of this policy it is acknowledged that a disability may be of permanent or temporary and it may be sensory, physical, cognitive or psychological in nature. The disability may prevent full and equal academic, social and economic participation.

# CANCELLATION POLICY

## **Qualifications**

Any student who cancels within 7 days of payment of the securing deposit fee will be refunded in full in terms of the requirements of the National Credit Act.

All cancellations made after registration are liable for the total programme fees irrespective of whether or not the student attends any lecturers or completes the programme. Failure to attend will not reduce or alter the student's liability to pay the full programme fees for the current year of study.

Equipment fee payments are not refundable under any circumstances after 7 days of payment.

## **Short Courses**

The securing deposit and equipment fee is only refundable if cancellation of studies is made within 7 days of payment of the registration fee/equipment fee. and prior to the signing of the registration document.

All cancellations made after registration are liable for the total short course fees irrespective of whether or not the student attends the course. Failure to attend will not reduce or alter the student's liability to pay the full short course fees.



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## CONDITIONS OF REGISTRATION



- The training venue is Villioti Fashion Institute, Albury Office Park or any additional venues utilised for training and/or practical component requirements of the Programme for which the Student is registered.
- Registration for the Programme is on condition that you have been awarded the South African National Senior Certificate or equivalent in order to meet the entrance requirements. A certified copy must be submitted on or before. Students holding foreign certificates will need to supply Villioti Fashion Institute with a letter from South African Qualifications Authority confirming that their qualification is equivalent to the South African National Senior Certificate to confirm that they meet the entrance requirements.
- If you are being sponsored, you agree that notwithstanding any arrangement between you and the sponsor, you will be jointly and severally liable with such sponsor (being the Person Responsible for Programme Fees) for the Programme Fees.
- The Person Responsible for Programme Fees remains liable for the Programme Fees as per this Agreement irrespective of whether or not the Student attends all training sessions or completes the Programme. Failure to attend will not reduce or alter the liability to pay the full Programme Fees in accordance with this Agreement.
- Should the Person Responsible for Programme Fees fail to make any payments to Villioti Fashion Institute due in terms of this Agreement (including payments for the Programme) as stipulated in this Agreement and fail to remedy such non-payment within up to 1 (one) week of receipt of written notice (at management's discretion) from Villioti Fashion Institute to do so, the following consequences will occur and/or following actions will be taken at the discretion of management against both the Person Responsible for Programme Fees and the Student:
  - Any balance outstanding in relation to the Programme Fees will become immediately due and payable.
  - Villioti Fashion Institute may levy its default penalty fee set out in the Policies (including specifically the Financial Policy).
  - Any discount previously applied to the Programme Fees (as indicated above under the heading "Programme Fee Options") will be revoked, and such discount amount will become immediately due and payable along with the Programme Fees as described immediately above.
  - An administration fee of R500.00 will be charged on overdue accounts per week until the account is up to date or handed over to a registered debt collection agency.
  - Villioti Fashion Institute will suspend the Student until such time as the Programme Fees have been settled up to date.
  - Access to Villioti Fashion Institute's online Student Portal will be blocked.
  - No certificates/qualifications will be issued to the Student by Villioti Fashion Institute in relation to the Programme until all outstanding Programme Fees are settled.
  - Villioti Fashion Institute has the rights to list and/or trace debtors at a Credit Bureau should they default as required by the National Credit Regulator.
  - Any fees incurred in the recovery of any amount owing to Villioti Fashion Institute will be recovered (including legal fees on an attorney and own client basis).
  - Any fees incurred by Villioti Fashion Institute relating to cash deposits, credit card payments or international transfers into Villioti Fashion Institute's bank account will be levied to the Student's account.
  - The Programme Fees are pre-determined each year by the management of Villioti Fashion Institute. Programme Fee

- Increases take place on the 1st of November of each year.
- Students will be notified in October of each year of Programme Fee increases implemented by Villioti Fashion Institute for the following year of study.
- Specialist equipment packs are provided by Villioti Fashion Institute on an annual basis. Students will be notified in October of each year of the cost of the equipment packs for the next year of study. Equipment pack payments are due by the end of January of the current year for distribution in February of the next academic year.
- Parking is available on site subject to a fee from time to time.
- This Agreement is not transferable to another person other than the Student as reflected in this Agreement.
- All training material and equipment (other than the equipment pack purchased by the Student) are the property of Villioti Fashion Institute and must not be removed from the premises of Villioti Fashion Institute.
- All tuition material remains copyright property of Villioti Fashion Institute, and the Student agrees that they may not under any circumstances use any such material other than for legitimate study purposes related to the Programme.
- Assessment results are communicated via the Student Portal and by no other means. The Student, their Guardian and the Person Responsible for Programme Fees (should the Student agree to share their information) are required to access the Student Portal to obtain results via the gradebook, track attendance percentages, comments on progress and view communication from Villioti Fashion Institute.
- E-mail communication is limited to teaching and learning support, administration, all matters relating to fees, serious incidents and service communications. E-mail communication to the Student will only be sent out to a registered student's Villioti Fashion Institute issued e-mail address. The Student, their Guardian and the Person Responsible for Programme Fees are encouraged to monitor their e-mail communications multiple times a day.
- Villioti Fashion Institute must be notified immediately of any changes made to the personal particulars of the Student, Guardian or Person Responsible for Programmes Fees.
- Assessment results may only be disputed by means of Villioti Fashion Institute's Student Appeals Policy.
- Should the Student not attain the requisite "Duly Performed" requirement (see below, under "Student Code of Conduct" for more details), not meet their requisite attendance requirement or simply wish to improve their results they are entitled to apply to the examination committee to go on an assessed tailor-made "Intensive Programme" for a one or two week period during the summer/winter break. The Intensive Programmes are costed at R2 500.00 per course. Payment needs to be made prior to the commencement of the Intensive Programme.
- Students wanting to give themselves the best possible chance of being found competent for a course at each level of a Programme can apply for a supplementary examination. Each supplementary submission will need to be accompanied by R550.00 payment per submission before the commencement of the exam.
- Special case arrangements for summative assessments may be made once documentation is received from a legitimate and recognised medical professional. A cost of R650.00 will be levied for any special case arrangement requiring one on one invigilation.
- Students appealing a mark given may appeal for a remark at a cost of R600.00 per assignment or exam.
- Villioti Fashion Institute retains the right to suspend a student pending a disciplinary hearing as per Villioti Fashion Institute's Student Disciplinary Policy.
- All students must ensure they obtain and familiarise themselves with the Villioti Fashion Institute Student Code of Conduct (set out below), and sign acknowledgement of understanding. All students will be required to adhere to the rules and regulations of Villioti Fashion Institute for the duration of the Programme.

- Right of admission is reserved. Villioti Fashion Institute reserves the right to reject a Programme registration or exclude the Student from training sessions for non-compliance with the terms of this Agreement.
- If Villioti Fashion Institute is prevented or restricted from carrying out any or all of its obligations under this Agreement, whether directly or indirectly by any cause beyond their reasonable control, including, without limitations, acts of God, civil commotion, riots, strikes, insurrection, acts of government, fire, explosion, the elements, epidemics or pandemics, governmental embargoes, load shedding or like causes ("force majeure"), Villioti Fashion Institute (the party so affected) shall, to the extent so prevented, be relieved of its obligations in terms of this Agreement during the period of such events and shall not be liable for any delay or failure in the performance of any obligations hereunder or loss or damage either general, special or consequential which the Student may suffer due to or resulting from such delay or failure; provided always that written notice of the occurrence constituting force majeure shall be given within 48 (forty eight) hours by Villioti Fashion Institute.
- Students are required to hand in the documentation listed at the end of this document, to enable final registration.
- No relaxation of any of these terms of this Agreement by Villioti Fashion Institute for any reason whatsoever shall be a waiver of its rights in terms of this Agreement or constitute a variation of this Agreement.
- You and the Person Responsible for Programme Fees agree that:
  - for all purposes of this Agreement, communication by way of e-mail shall be valid and binding;
